Shopping spree for Lowcountry Orphan Relief happening at Tanger Outlets

NORTH CHARLESTON, S.C. (WCIV) — When we shop, most of the time, it's for us.

That's not the case at the Tanger Outlets Monday morning.

Several sponsors, including Suburban Propane, The Tanger Outlets and the Charleston RiverDogs, will be holding a shopping spree to help kids who need clothes.

It's all part of the mission to help Lowcountry Orphan Relief.

Sponsors will fill up shopping bags with children's clothing to help create a care kit - which consists of about two weeks' worth of necessities for the child.

Officials with the shopping spree are hopeful to provide for about 100 kids.

Christina Pope with Lowcountry Orphan Relief says, a lot of the times, when children are removed from homes, they're unable to go back for their belongings.

That's where her team comes in.

Within 48 hours of receiving a referral, a care kit is filled for that child.

"It's such a beautiful thing when the community comes together and rallies for, you know, deserving kids who are without and shouldn't be," said Pope.

She adds about 5,000 care kits are filled each year in the Lowcountry.

This is for kids who aren't even born yet all the way up to 18-year-olds.

The event on April 5th is just the shopping spree. On April 12th, the organizations will head to the Joe Riley Stadium to pack up the care kits, then distribute them.
